109 bodysuits, 40 sleepers, 47 outfits, 54 bibs, 82 pairs of socks, plus sweaters, swaddlers, caps, and more, 2 baby monitors, 7



thermometers, 2 soft support seats and several

generous cash donations to help purchase new cribs, car seats, and to support the sonogram program which helps them continue their life-saving work with new mothers and their babies for many months. They thank you for standing for life.






while another wanted a Raven's hoodie. We found a cuddly teddy


